1.0 Call to Order & Pledge Allegiance to the Flag: The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by Chair James Grant.

2.0 Swearing in: Peter Venturini was sworn in by Lewis Murray as a member of the Lake Arrowhead MAC. Peter introduced himself and thanked everyone for his appointment. He is looking forward to serving on the MAC.

3.0 Approval of Minutes: Thursday, April 14, 2022 meeting

A motion was made by Michelle Ambrozic and seconded by Ken Stowe to approve the minutes of the April 14th meeting. Approved 4/0/1 (Peter Venturini abstained)

4.0 Special Guests:

- a. San Bernardino County Code Enforcement: Ignacio Nunez gave a presentation regarding the recent board-approved Light Trespass (Dark Skies) Ordinance. Nunez discussed previous changes to the ordinance, regional based standards, simplified enforcement standards, compliance timeline, and exceptions to the ordinance. He then explained how they are encouraging residents and businesses to comply to the ordinance now, rather than waiting until it takes effect. Nunez then answered questions from the audience.**

5.0 Community & Agency Updates:

- **San Bernardino County Sheriff:** Captain Lupear discussed staffing levels at the Twin Peaks station. They have a new sergeant starting on May 9th. They are adding two razor vehicles and two quads for back country patrols. They will be launching their boat on Lake Arrowhead for the Memorial Day weekend. He discussed recent dive team training on Lake Arrowhead and a 2-day training with the local fire departments. Coffee with a cop will be on June 8th, 8:30 am at the Tea and Coffee Exchange in Lake Arrowhead Village.
- **California Highway Patrol:** Sgt. Kee introduced himself. He recently transferred from the Victorville office. He discussed the current emergency project on Hwy 18, and lack of current staffing levels. They currently have 24 patrol officers.
- **US Forest Service:** Brian Grant gave an update on staffing levels, fire prevention crews preparing for summer, and the opening of fire lookouts on May 1st. He also mentioned that there will be no pile burnings for the time being.
- **Cal Fire:** Bret Taylor discussed staffing levels. No resources are out of the area at this time. All training is up to date. He also shared that 12,000 tree seedlings are being used for planting near the Boy Scout Camp in Cedar Glen.
- **Arrowhead Lake Association:** Bob Mattison shared that the season has begun and they are launching lots of bots. Membership renewals are happening at a quick pace. Many are renewing online. The lake is about 2 ½ feet below full. They are opening up a satellite office in Lake Arrowhead Village to manage the Short-Term Rental usage of the lake.
- **Rim of the World Recreation and Park District:** Jenny Hueter discussed upcoming events and activities. She also shared that they are starting a flag football program for ages 6 to 14. She also discussed the community garden program.
- **Congressman Obernolte's Office:** Hayden Bartz discussed gas prices, and fighting to open energy resources in our country.

6.0 Supervisor's Report: Lewis Murray discussed the vacancy on the Lake Arrowhead Dam Advisory, upcoming Short-Term Rental hearing at the Board of Supervisor's meeting, and the overnight parking in turn-out issue.

7.0 Correspondence & Announcements from Board Members: None

8.0 New Business: Discussion occurred regarding the formation of a committee to look into the possibility of opening and improving Hwy 173 from Grass Valley Road to Hesperia. Chair Grant will put together a committee.
